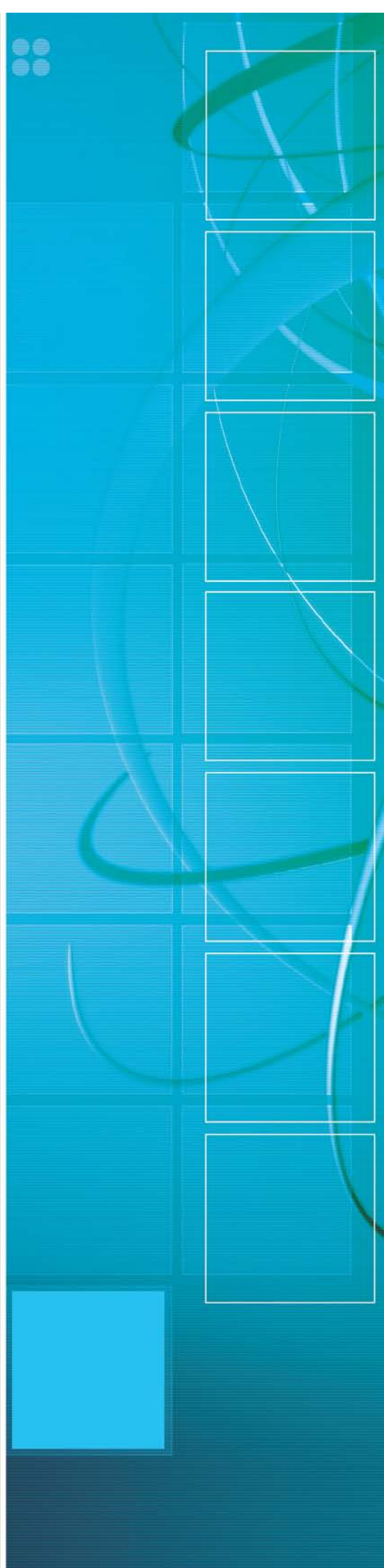

The Life Membership list of Point Danger Branch is carved from greatness; it includes those men and women whose dedication to lifesaving goes far beyond the realms of the association.

Combined these members have personally coached, mentored, trained and advised countless numbers of members and clubs.

Point Danger Branch was built on the backs of the men and women on this list. These are individuals who show no wish for personal recognition or reward. They have not and do not seek these entitlements but the community and lifesavers Australia wide owe this to them

EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

On the eve of the 90th season of Point Danger Branch, it is pleasing to offer a report to the members that showcases the strengths of the Branch, its affiliated clubs and members in all portfolios of Surf Life Saving. In our inaugural season of 1924/1925, we had 91 members - today we number 5307.

Each season, the Executive Committee strive to ensure the continuing success of the Branch and its affiliated Clubs though identifying priorities to meet the inevitable challenges that life saving presents.

Reflecting on our noted challenges for this season we can record the following

- ≡ Constitutions – the Branch ran a workshop on the new constitution and our Clubs are now working towards implementing this at club level (with one Club already achieving this).
- ≡ Administrative Training – training for Administrators occurred last season and continuation of this in the off season commences with the Annual Administration Workshop.
- ≡ Policy – the Branch in season 13/14 has adopted new policy's relating to Trainers & Assessors and Workcover.
- ≡ Trainers & Assessors: a focus on Trainers and Assessors this season has been paramount with continuing upgrades and assistance to members in gaining necessary awards.
- ≡ 90th Anniversary: in a very lucky moment – Point Danger Branch has had returned to her, all the Annual reports from 1924 – 1948, as well as the minutes from the initial meeting planning the Branch.

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

- ≡ Our clubs performed 994 preventative actions on the beach and provided water safety advice to (people warned) to a further 12291 people.
- ≡ Continuation of sponsorships with Goldling and Sizzler.
- ≡ Increase in the Representative Team Sponsorship through the addition of Wise Management Solutions, Wave Warriors and Breakaway Finance.
- ≡ In kind support from Staminade and Cannibal Sports.
- ≡ Donations increased this season – through Ricoh, Minister Jann Stuckey MP.
- ≡ Focus on Trainers and Assessors.
- ≡ Completion of 4th round of Team X-Treme .
- ≡ Registration as a licensed provider with SLSQ which will allow us to run commercial courses.
- ≡ Liaison with Our Community Connect to get an APP for Point Danger Branch.



DELIVERY OF CORE SERVICE

The central component to all that we do rests with the provision of voluntary patrols on our beaches, our Clubs and members strive to ensure that the beach going public are safe whilst they enjoy the iconic beaches of the Gold Coast. Our Clubs achieve this goal each season with focus on development of members, purchase of appropriate and necessary equipment and establishment of contemporary life saving management practices.

To this end the Branch has assisted the Clubs financially through monies received from the Gold Coast City Council and assisted the Clubs in writing submissions for the SLSQ/DCS Sustainability and More Beaches Under Guard Funding Scheme. Further, the Branch has continued to plan training and educational opportunities for our Clubs and members to ensure that our members are trained to the highest level and our Clubs are in adherence to the SLSQ Patrol Operations Manual and Agreements.

SURF SPORTS

Season 2013/2014 has seen the 6th season of the Sizzler Oceans 38 Premiership Series finish with Point Danger Branch continuing to oversee the logistical and administrative side of this event on behalf of the three southern Branches.

The Branch was also asked this season to run the Dolphin Ocean Classic at Northcliffe SLSC (logistics and administration). This was a positive partnership that the Branch assisted with and we have gained a constructive and fruitful relationship with Northcliffe SLSC as a result.

The Branch Representative Team continues to go from strength to strength with an increase in sponsorship, more defined team management structure and former Nutri Grain Ironman – Hugh Dougherty coaching the team. As a Branch we performed well and the results compared to the previous season were far better – with particular improvement in the pool rescue events.

The carnivals this season all ran successfully with all events being able to be finalised.

MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY

Some necessary building repairs this season ensured some larger than expected expenditure in the Branch budget, however we have maintained our adherence to our budget and have finished the season in a strong position.

This season the Branch has signed a three (3) year agreement with the Gold Coast City Council which cements the funding levels for future years. This funding is essential to the Clubs and Branch to maintain current levels of administration (Branch) as well as the purchase and maintenance of life saving equipment (clubs).

The Interbranch Team support has continued with support from three local businesses and also the in-kind support from Cannibal.

Our local representatives – Karen Andrews MP, The Honourable Jann Stuckey MP and Michael Hart MP have continued their generous support of our annual awards – with their contribution going towards the Life Saver of the Year, Patrol Club of the Year and Club of the Year.

The Branch has submitted a number of grant applications towards the continuation of our youth program and also building maintenance and repairs. We are awaiting the outcome of these grants for the coming season.

This season the Branch has become a licensed provider through SLSQ which will allow us to run commercial CPR, First Aid, ART and Certificate 2 courses. It is hoped that this initiative will provide an extra income stream for the Branch.

SLSQ Point Danger Branch has maintained a proactive stance in gaining donations for use by the Branch.

CORPORATE AND OPERATIONAL GOVERNANCE

Governance has long been a priority for Point Danger Branch, whereby we have initiated a number of programs and reviews to ensure that the Branch and its Clubs are compliant across the required areas. This season saw the introduction of the Child Youth Risk Management (CYRM) Workshops for our Clubs. In former seasons issues occurred with the induction of members into this process. It is noted that this initiative ensured that Point Danger Branch was the only compliant Branch by the due date. This support for our Clubs will continue into next season.

Another of the main focus areas was red tape reduction - to this end we have changed some paper based items into electronic e.g. on line Team Managers Declarations to ensure that the systems of the Branch are more user friendly.

STRATEGIC PLAN

The Branch has continued its focus on enacting outcomes from the strategic plan. We are now at the end of the current plan and are working on steps toward the provision of another plan for the Branch and Clubs. This will include consultation with key stakeholders. Our aim is to gain funding for this through Sport and Recreation Queensland.

MEMBERSHIP

Overall Membership

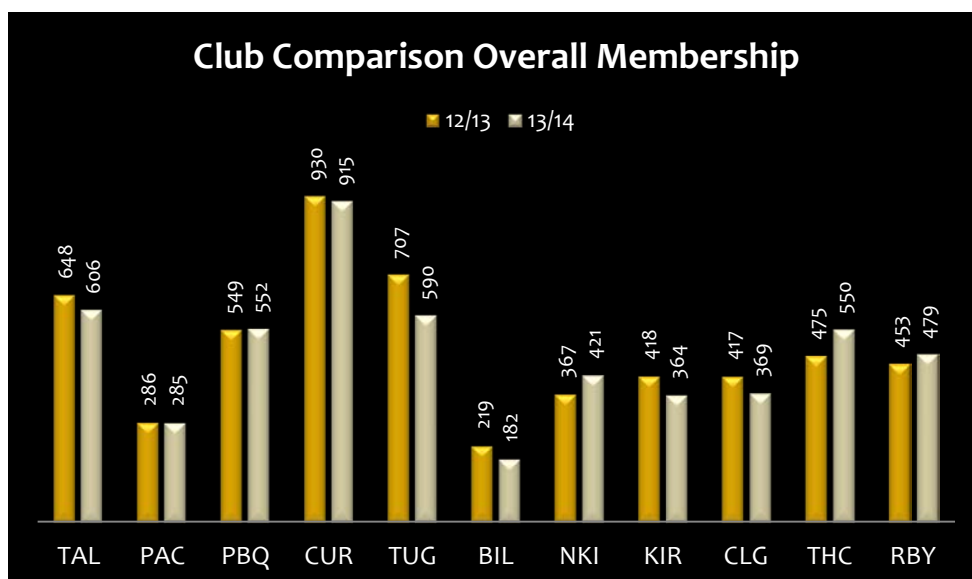
In season 2013/2014 the Branch has posted another slight decrease in membership. Noting that in the 7 year comparison study, decreases have occurred only in the last 2 seasons. Prior to this we experienced 5 seasons of growth.

In season 2013/2014 the Branch finished the season with 5323 members, compared to 5482 members last season. As such we have retained 96.38% of membership from the previous season, losing 159 members overall.



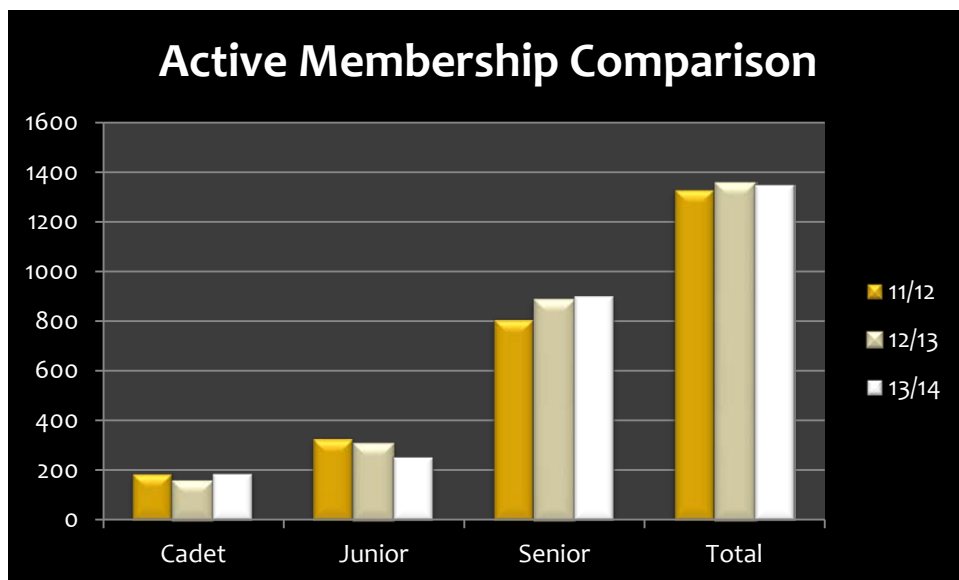
Club Membership

Four (4) Clubs in the Branch increased membership this season. The largest increase was experienced by TH&C SLSC with an increase of 75 members overall. Seven (7) clubs have shown a decrease in membership – noting that the decrease for Pacific SLSC was only 1 member and the largest decrease was from Tugun (-117 members).



ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

Active Membership in season 2013/2014 showcased some interesting statistics. Overall we finished the season with only a slight decrease on the previous season (-8). An increase in the Active Cadets (+31) and Active Seniors (+13) was shown with a large decrease in the Active Junior (-52)



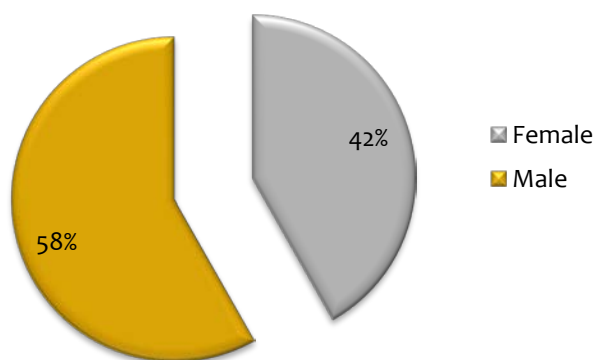
Other membership categories that support the Active Categories have also experienced some change in numbers

Interestingly, one of the membership categories that experienced the biggest growth was the Life Membership category. This category increased from 168 in 12/13 to 197 in 13/14 (+29). This will certainly account for some of the changes in other categories as members category's have been changed to Life Members.

The gender split of our membership is similar to the previous season with the male membership 58% (down 1%) and female 42% (up 1%).

Of the twenty membership categories that we have, females have the greater numbers in 6 categories (Associate, Award, U10, U12, U13 and U14),



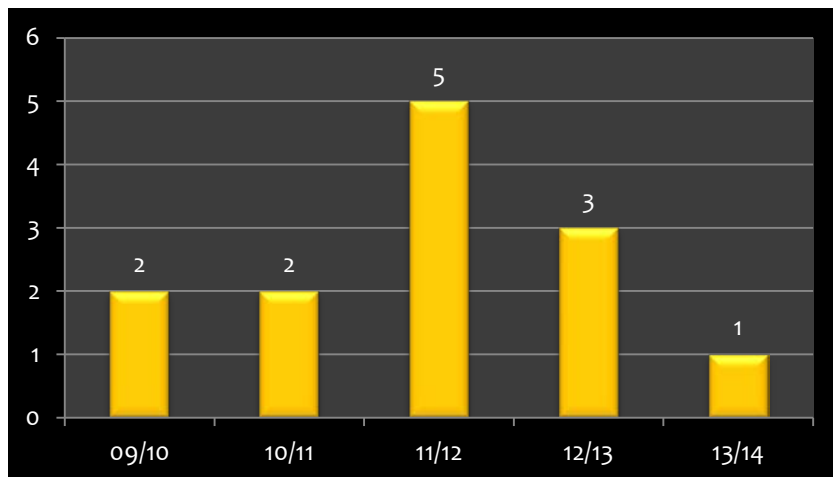
LIFE SAVING SERVICES

In season 2013/2014 our Clubs and members approached their operational requirements with enthusiasm and dedication. Again, no lives were lost on the beaches of Point Danger Branch. The clubs have ensured engagement with the local community through the provision of volunteer patrols and surf safety on the Gold Coast beaches.

PATROL AGREEMENTS

The Patrol Agreements are the foremost document for our clubs each season and ensure adherence to the SLSQ Patrol Operations Manual. Each season the Clubs and Branch collectively sign this document for presentation to SLSQ. The Policy Document compiled in season 2012/2013 in relation to Patrol Breaches has ensured that both the clubs and Branch have a clear direction on the handling of any substantiated breaches.

The number of breaches in recent seasons has been maintained at an extremely low level. Congratulations must be extended to the clubs and members on their positive effort in this regard.



LIFESAVING FUNDING

Each season the Clubs and Branch have the opportunity to apply to SLSQ for the SLSQ/DCS Sustainability and More Beach Under Guard Funding Program. This season, as in former seasons, the Branch and its clubs have been proactive in applying for and gaining funding to maintain their life saving services.

One of the key focuses for the Branch this season has been our Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators (TAF). Again, there have been a number of changes in the requirements for these members to have to be able to continue to train and assess. Point Danger Branch's goal has been to ensure that the ease of gaining these necessary prerequisites exists for our members.

At the close of season 2013/2014 the Branch numbers of TAFs has certainly increased. The Branch has the following

- ≡ Trainers x 85
- ≡ Assessors x 65
- ≡ Facilitators x 56
- ≡ Probationary Trainers x 15
- ≡ Probationary Assessors x 5

Throughout the season the members (both existing & new) were required to gain necessary qualifications to continue their training and assessing activities. To this end the following awards relevant to training and assessing were processed

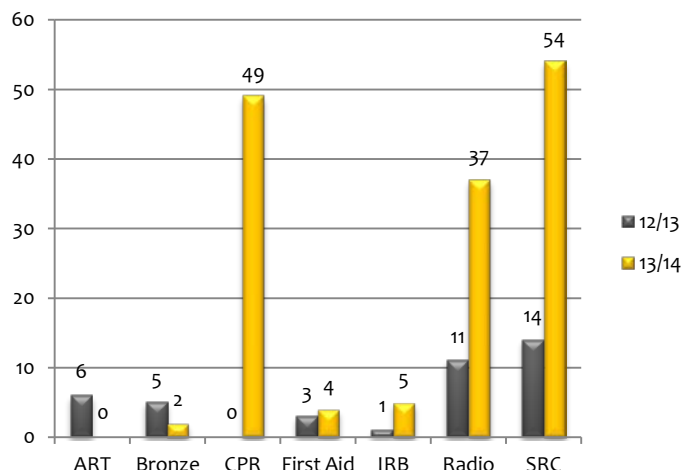
- ≡ Certificate 4 x 25
- ≡ TAE Assessor Upgrade x 80
- ≡ TAE Trainer Upgrade x 60
- ≡ New Trainers in Progress (doing course) x 13
- ≡ New Assessors in Progress (doing course) x 6

The Branch teamed up with an external agency to ensure that our members could get the necessary awards within a timely and efficient manner. To date this has proven to be a wise choice and the number of members who are upskilling or gaining awards for the first time has increased

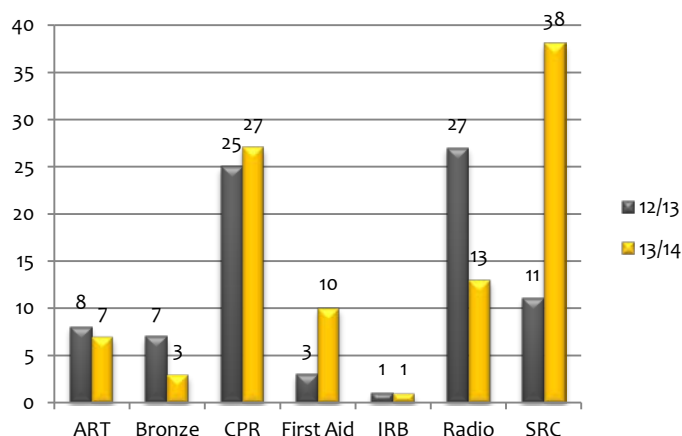
Once our members have gained the necessary theoretical prerequisites, they then go onto gain the SLSA Trainer Officer, Assessor or Facilitator awards. Through all of the courses and the reviews carried out this season, the increase in awards was large. One of the Branch Development Officers was tasked to focus on the Trainers and Assessors to ensure their needs were met. A review was also carried out to ensure that all of the TAF's had the correct awards. As such 689 new awards were processed this season for Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators.

There are some positive changes endorsed for the coming season in relation to the method in which Trainers and Assessors can gain awards. This will make the process of gaining/becoming a Trainer or Assessor easier and we are hopeful this will encourage more members to pursue this area in life saving. From season 14/15 members will have to train or assess one chosen award (following the necessary guidelines), once they have gained a Training Officer or Assessor award in one discipline, they can get the same award in another with only an induction into the paperwork and sign off from the Branch. In previous years it was necessary to train and assess (as a probationary) for each award you wanted, which was time consuming and did not assist in increasing numbers.

Assessor Comparison



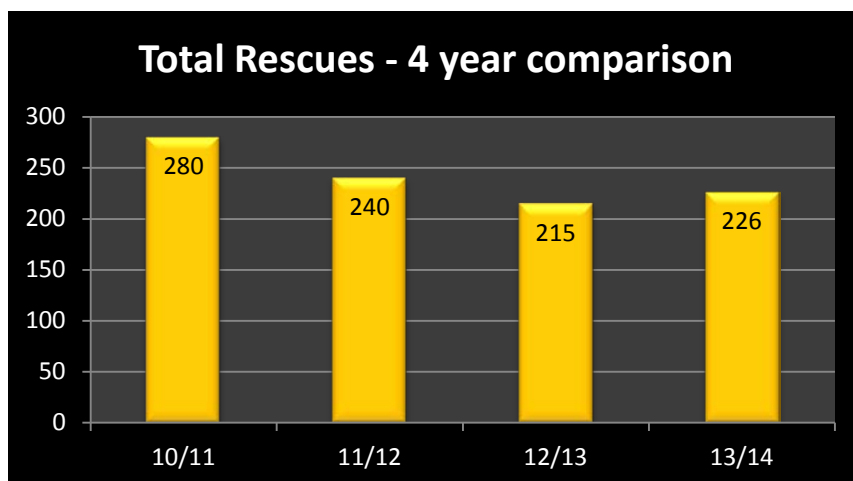
PATROL STATISTICS

There has been an increase in overall rescues from season 2012/2013 (215) to season 13/14 (226). An overall increase of 11 rescues performed by the Clubs. Though this is still a significant decrease from our highest rescue year recently (280 in season 10/11).

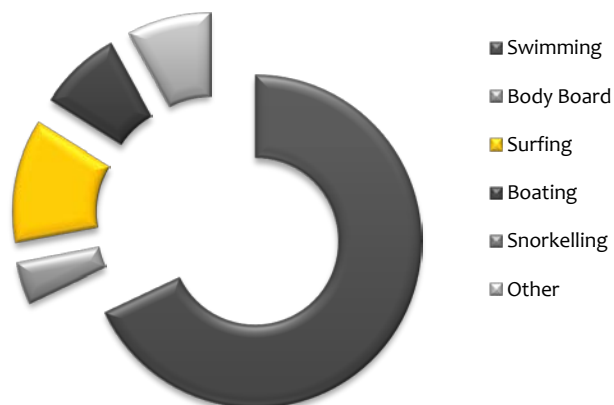
In recent years the most popular piece of equipment used for rescues has been the IRB. However in season 2013/2014, the Rescue Board proved to be the most used piece of equipment in a rescue (34.95% of all rescues), followed by the Rescue Tube (30.09%) and the IRB (17.7%).

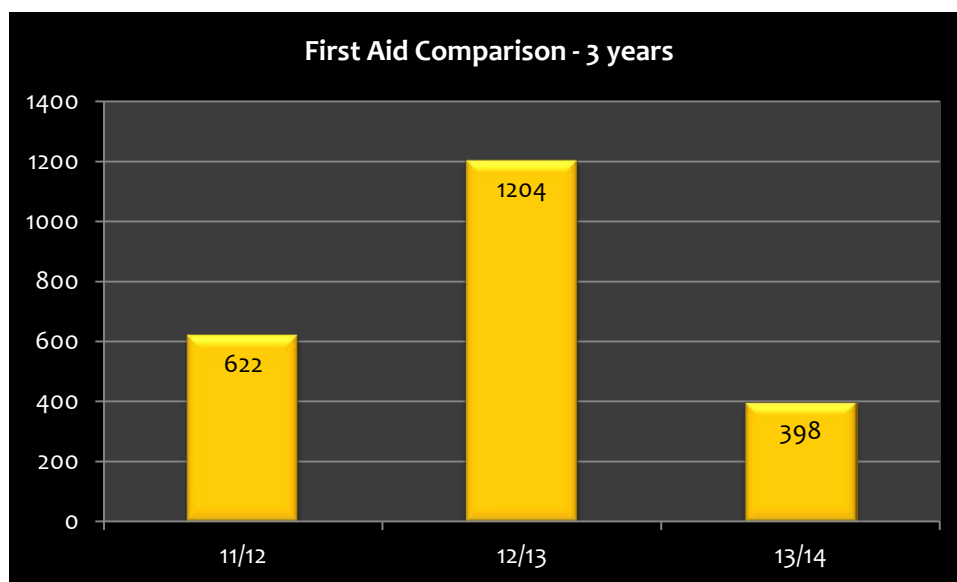
Activity During Rescue



Other than rescues, there are many other components to the contemporary patrol. Preventative actions, warning people and treating first aid cases are all a significant part of everyday patrols. There was an increase in preventative actions this season (+147), people warned has also increased (+ 2135).

It was disappointing to note the number of swimmers outside of the flagged area increased by 5250. This will explain the increase in preventive actions and people warned.

First Aid injuries showed a huge decrease from 847 in season 2013/2013 to 371 in season 2013/2014. The biggest decrease overall was in the marine stings (956 to 122). However there seemed to be an overall increase in other major forms of first aid injuries - oxygen therapy (15 to 27), fractures (7 to 12), suspected spinal (1 to 6), heart related (1 to 5) and shock (1 to 4).

TRAINING AND EDUCATION

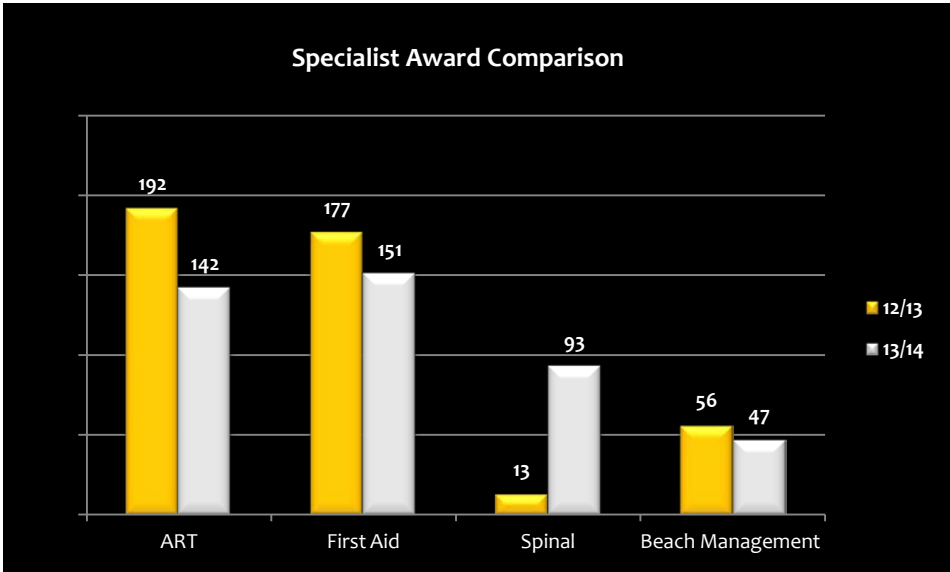
The Branch continued its long term commitment to assisting the Clubs in the provision of training and educational opportunities for members. Each year the Branch ensures that there are a number of specialist courses available for the Clubs and members to attend. This is aimed at assisting the Clubs to upskill their members and for the Branch to develop new Trainers and Assessors and maintain competence for existing Trainers and Assessors.

To that end the Branch conducted 35 courses for members this season including Spinal Management, ART, Beach Management, First Aid, Age Manager and CPR. We have also assisted in facilitating external educational opportunities for our members through the provision of Marine Licence and Certificate 4 courses.



Some changes will occur next season to the training calendar – the Age Managers course is now available on line and as such face to face courses will cease (unless there are specific requests). This will allow the Branch to add more courses for other awards onto the scope, especially concentrating on Marine Licence courses for the Clubs. In total the Branch has 31 courses scheduled for the coming season and will most likely add more as the season progresses and the needs of the Clubs become clearer.

Overall in the specialist awards we have seen a decrease, however as all of these awards have had large increases in recent seasons, we now have more members needing to gain proficiency rather than the new award. This season the focus was on Spinal Management (a new award from season 2012/2013) and there has been an overall increase of 80 awards gained this season.



Other awards that are always important for the Clubs to focus on are the Vehicle related awards. Members are not permitted to drive any club vehicle without the necessary induction course. Once gained, members hold this award for life (as long as their relevant State Driver’s Licence remains current).

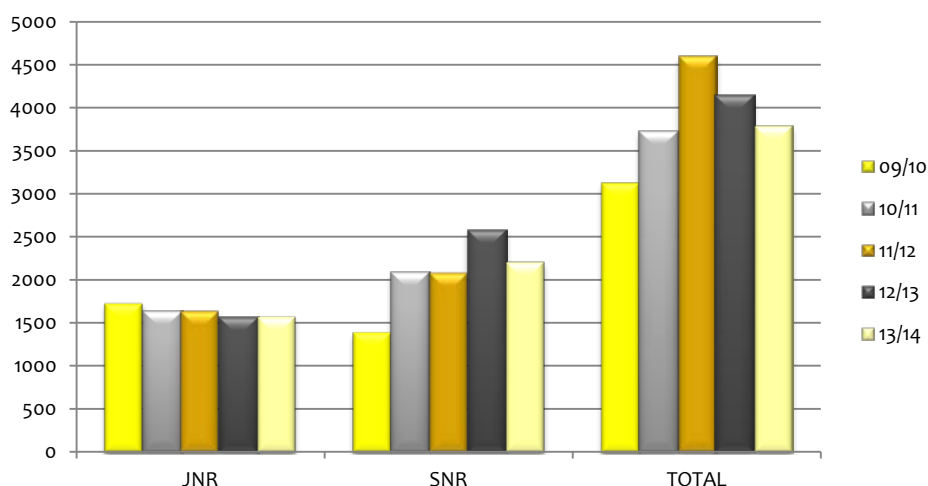
This season there has been a decrease overall of senior awards processed – 2577 (season 12/13) to 2207 (13/14) – an overall decrease of 370 awards gained.

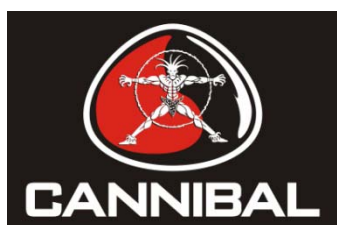
INTERBRANCH CHAMPIONSHIPS

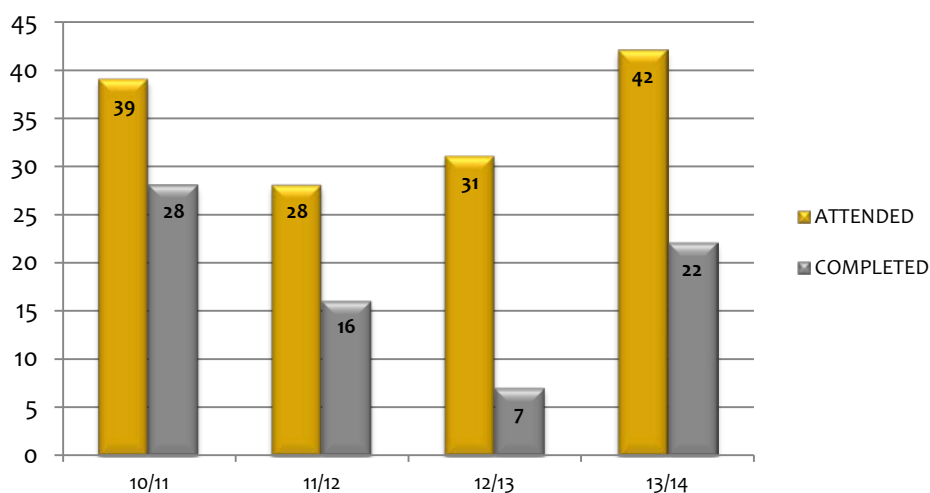
SURF SPORTS OFFICIALS

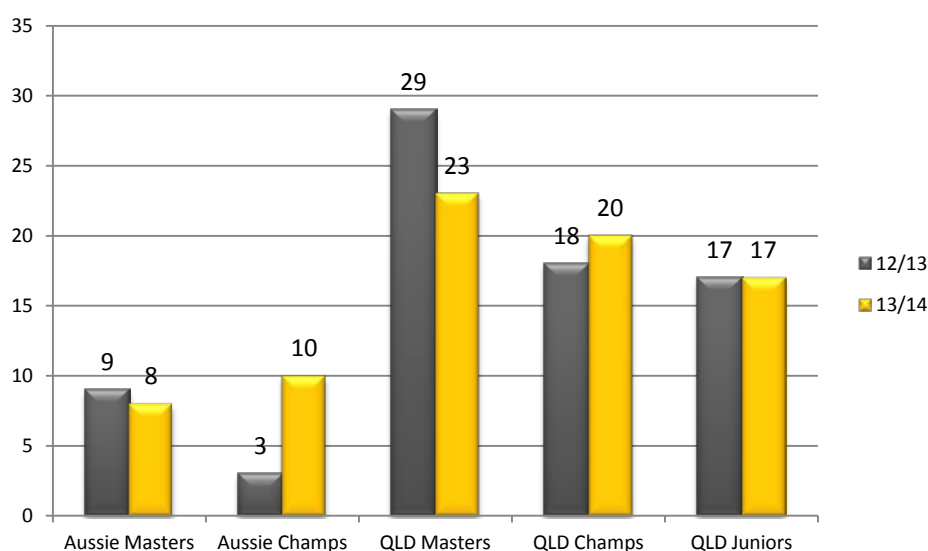

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

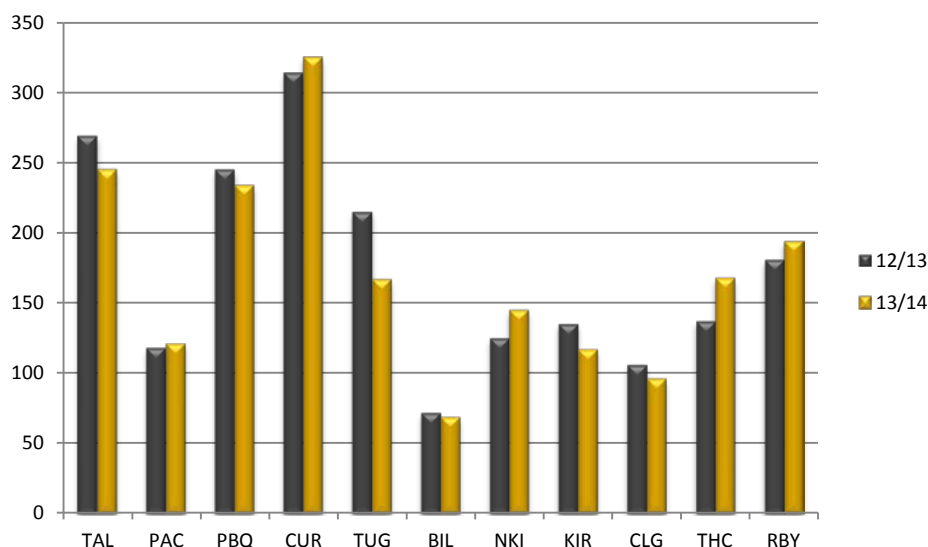
The strength of any area of surf lifesaving can be seen in its junior ranks – and this season the Point Danger Branch Clubs and nippers have gone from strength to strength. Collectively the Clubs have achieved some great results

The relationship between the Branch and the Junior Clubs has continued in a positive nature, with regular meetings, provision of nipper CPR courses, CYRM Workshops and Junior Information Sessions for the development of the Clubs.

MEMBERSHIP

The season finished with 1881 nippers overall (it should be noted that 9 nippers changed their membership category to Active Cadet ½ way through the season). This is a slight decrease on last season of 36 members overall. This is a great result (the change in nipper membership from 11/12 to 12/13 was 310 nippers).



Overall five (5) Clubs showcased an increase in members – Pacific, Currumbin, North Kirra, TH&C and Rainbow Bay. The largest increase was shown at TH&C SLSC (+31 members). The other six Clubs showcased decreases in membership - the largest decrease at Tugun (- 48 members).

There are 9 age groups in the nippers membership – five of the age groups showcased increases in membership – Under 9, Under 11, Under 12, Under 13 and Under 14. The largest increase was in the Under 9 age group of 41 members (noting that last season this age group had the highest decrease). The other categories showcased decreases with the largest decrease in the Under 7 age group (-47 members).

JUNIOR EDUCATION

At the Junior Information Night, the Branch provided the Clubs with educational packs to assist them in the development of nippers (posters, booklets etc). OFFICIALS

This season there was an increase in participants at the Level One Officials course. 42 members in total attended the 2 available courses – 28 of these members were from the junior ranks. A Level O official's course is now available and this is a condensed course for members who wish to become officials – this level is for Officials at junior events only.

AGE MANAGERS

Some changes to the Age Managers course this season has given the ability for members to do the theoretical component online. 35 members have gained the on line theory awards and 19 members attended the face to face course. Overall 46 members gained the Age Managers Accreditation in season 2013/2014. Next season the Branch will not be running face to face Age Managers Courses and will direct members towards the on line course (noting that they must complete an on the beach practical component prior to gaining the award).

NIPPER CPR

To support the Clubs, the Branch ran a number of Nipper CPR course again this season – catering for the Under 13 Age Group (as they have more components for their age award). Some changes to this requirement will be implemented into the 2014/2015 season.



JUNIOR SURF SPORTS

Junior Surf Sports is an important component of not only the development of the Nipper members, but the retention of membership too. The Branch hosted five (5) carnivals this season

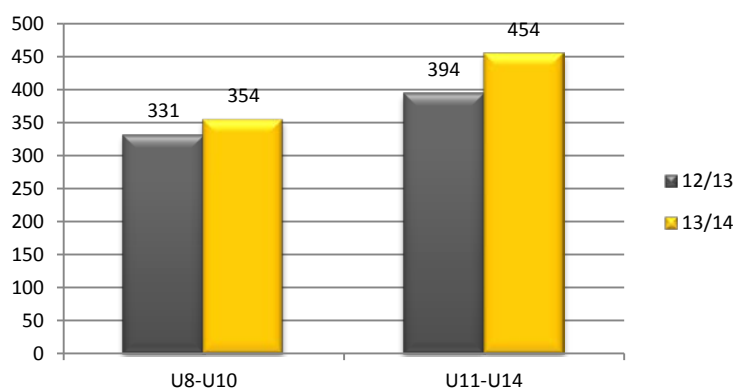

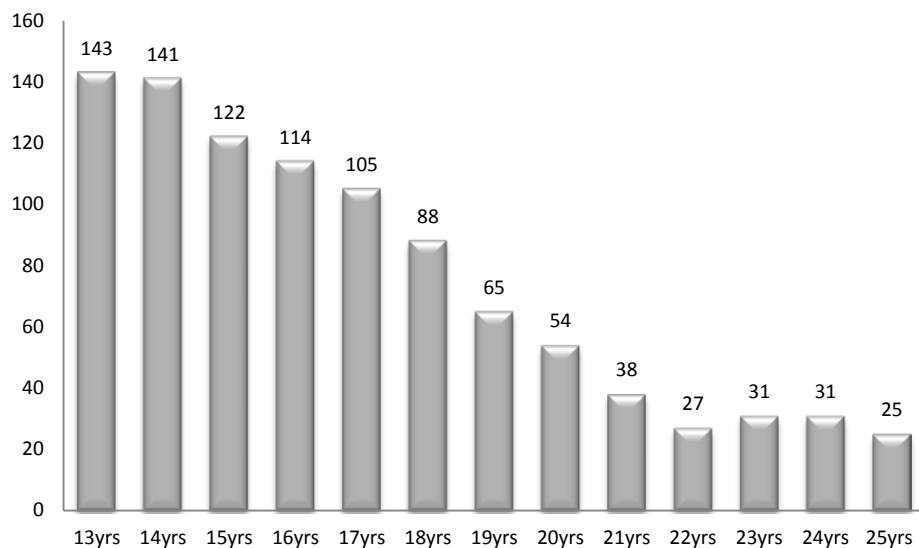
YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Youth Development in Point Danger Branch is going from strength to strength with an increase in members and clubs participating in youth camps, youth activities and programs. The Branch Team X-Treme program is proving to be a popular and worthwhile program (statistics and information in the Development Officer section). The development of youth members is paramount to the ongoing future success of the Clubs and it is pleasing to see the clubs and members embracing these programs.

Gold Coast Youth Development (the joint venture with South Coast Branch) plans and oversees the yearly calendar of programs and camps aimed at this age group. In season 2014/2015 the Branch will be hosting a Youth Development information workshop to assist the new Youth Development Officers with their role and introduce them to the calendar of youth events for the season.

YOUTH MEMBERSHIP

In the allocated youth age groups (13 -25), the Branch numbers 984 members – the highest membership is in the 13 years age group and the lowest in the 22 years age group.



Each Club has a solid base of youth members with Currumbin, Tugun and Palm Beach posting the largest numbers in these age groups.



YOUTH PROGRAMS & EVENTS

Our members and Clubs have supported the Branch and State run programs and camps with an increase in participants at all events. It is pleasing to see the increase in attendance at these events and these activities will certainly help the Clubs retain membership futuristically.

BRANCH EVENTS

Our annual camps are organised by the Gold Coast Youth Development and involve Clubs from both Point Danger and South Coast Branches.

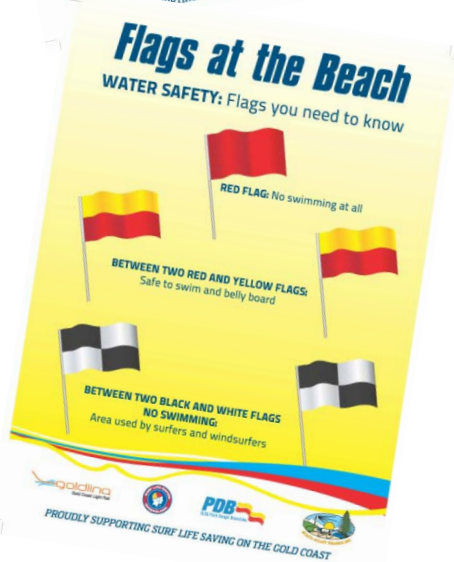
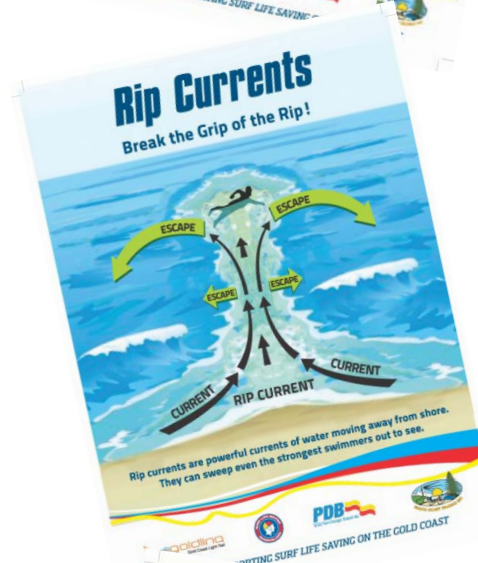

Upgrades were overseen by the Branch with personalised service and assistance given to each person.

SCHOOL TALKS



The Branch has been conducting school talks since 2011 when the Development Officers commenced employment. The Branch created its own school talk kit inclusive of props, handouts, posters and presentation. In the last 3 years the Branch has achieved the following statistics

- ≡ Showcased Surf Life Saving to 10822 students across the Gold Coast and Northern NSW



TEAM X-TREME

This program continues to gain momentum each season – in total the Branch has run four rounds of this program and this season saw the highest number of participants. The program is aimed at educating and developing members through the provision of awards, workshops and social activities.

Team X-Treme also introduces the members to other avenues in Surf Lifesaving such as Operations Support including helicopter, jet ski, jet boat and Surfcom. It is hoped the members are exposed to all opportunities that Surf Lifesaving can present.

Over the 4 rounds of Team X-Treme – 129 participants have gained 420 awards. These are presented to the members in a graduation ceremony at the end of each round (all certificates are presented in a keepsake folder).

VALE – HARRY POTTER

Following on from both of his eldest 2 sons joining Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club along with a large number of Junior Brisbane Brothers Rugby League Club members – Harry's interest in supporting and encouraging his family into sport led Harry to accept an invitation in 1963 to set up a Parents and Supporters Club with the assistance of his wife Sheila - this Club was enormously successful in not only raising much needed funds for the Surf Club but also a social club for parents with mutual interests to meet and in turn develop lifelong friendships.

Because of Harry's organisational and obvious business skills he was elected to the Building Committee to help develop a Financial Plan and a Loan repayment schedule for the building of the first beach side Clubhouse. He was then elected President of Coolangatta SLSC for 3 seasons from 1965/66 to 1967 /1968.

This was a very exciting time for the club as a new club house was opened in 1966, followed by show casing and hosting major Surf Life Saving events such as the Australian Championships and then hosting Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II at a special surf carnival.

Harry's contributions to the development of Coolangatta SLSC saw him rewarded with Life Membership of the club in 1976.

As well as his time spent at Coolangatta SLSC, Harry also dedicated time to Point Danger Branch, serving time as Treasurer (3 years) and Secretary (10 years) as well as other positions within the Branch.

For this service – Harry was awarded Life Membership of Point Danger Branch in 1978 by then President Mal McNeilly MBE who noted *"Harry was a member of the Branch Council for a number of Years then elected as Treasurer for 3 years followed by Secretary for 10 years. During that period the Branch was able to obtain land and build its own headquarters on Currumbin Creek ...A tireless worker for Surf Lifesaving and a great friend!"*

Harry's contribution to both Club and Branch towards the betterment of surf life saving will always be appreciated and honoured.



VALE – ROBERT GEAR AM

Robert (Bob) James Gear joined Kirra SLSC in the 1947/1948 season and gained his Bronze Medallion and Instructors Certificate in the 1954/55 Season and later became a Qualified Examiner. He dedicated many years of service to the training and assessing of fellow members.

At Club level he competed in R&R and swimming events. Unfortunately he had an accident whilst competing at football and then concentrated on coaching and administration. Bob coached at Club, Branch, State and International Level. His major achievements coaching were a State Senior R&R Team in 1973 and an Australian Junior R&R in 1979. He was also the coach of several Branch and State teams from 1966 to 1972 and he was



Coach of the Australian Team to South Africa in 1974 and to New Zealand in 1982.

Bob was one of the few members of Point Danger Branch who gained the Level 3 Officials Accreditation. He dedicated many years to Surf Sports as an Official – he officiated at all major carnivals, and has attended all Australian Championships since 1966. He was State Carnival Referee for 6 years and Sectional Referee at 8 Australian Championships as well as being Deputy Carnival Referee at 2 Australian Championships. At International Level he was a Sectional Referee from 1976 to 1996. There were few carnivals in the Branch or State that Bob did not attend – he was a well-liked and popular official who willingly mentored other officials and assisted competitors when need be. He could always be found at the end of the day with a XXXX Bitter in his hand and a story to tell. Bob was active as an Official up to the time of his death in 2013.

Bob held various positions across all levels of the association including President of Kirra SLSC (13 years), Point Danger Branch Superintendent Branch Delegate and Patron. He was also a member of the SLSQ Executive Committee, QLD Team Instructor.

Through his dedication to the Surf Life Saving movement through Club, Branch, State, National, and International levels, Bob was honoured many times

- ≡ Awarded International “Citation of Merit” – 2002
- ≡ Inducted into Surf Life Saving Australia “Hall of Fame” – 2007
- ≡ Awarded “Year of the Life Saver Medal” – 2007
- ≡ Presented with “International Life Saving President’s Medal” for his roll in setting up a Surf Life Saving Association in Taiwan.

Bob dedicated 65 years to Surf Life Saving – his commitment, hard work, leadership and long involvement will be the legacy he leaves to Surf Life Saving and to the community. Bob will be missed – as a leader, a mentor and friend.

CLUB REPORT – TALLEBUDGERA SLSC

Tallebudgera SLSC has experienced another successful season with no loss of life on Tallebudgera beach. The efforts of the patrolling members of Tallebudgera SLSC are to be congratulated.

Lifesaving has chosen to go down a competency based path with patrolling members requiring accreditations in a number of the many facets that makeup a patrol group. It is a credit to the club members that they have taken these responsibilities on in their stride.

The Club experienced many highlights throughout the season, including

- ≡ The success of the Junior Activities section with the flow on effect now felt by the Cadet group.
- ≡ Gold Coast City Council approval of the Club's reconfigured lease footprint which will enable planning for the future.
- ≡ The continued support of Club Sponsors. This support is appreciated given that the economy is not yet back on its feet.
- ≡ The new Constitutions for the Surf Club and Supporters Club have been drafted and are to be adopted by members.
- ≡ The Supporters Club continues to trade well in what is a very competitive market which is a great comfort to the Surf Club.
- ≡ Surf Sports had a successful season with good numbers attending carnivals. A special mention to the Club's Nipper Dads who competed with distinction at Branch this season leading the way for the Club's younger competitors.
- ≡ The Club saw some success at the Australian Championships - with 2 Gold (55-59 Double Ski and 55-59 Single Ski) and 1 Silver medal gained (Masters Surf Boats).

The support of local Politicians is essential to the success of any Surf Life Saving Club, as such Tallebudgera SLSC thanks Councilor Daphne MacDonald, Karen Andrews MP and Michael Hart MP, who have been great supporters of the Club throughout the season.

The Tallebudgera SLSC Executive Committee members have worked well together throughout the season to achieve the common goals of the Club and its members.



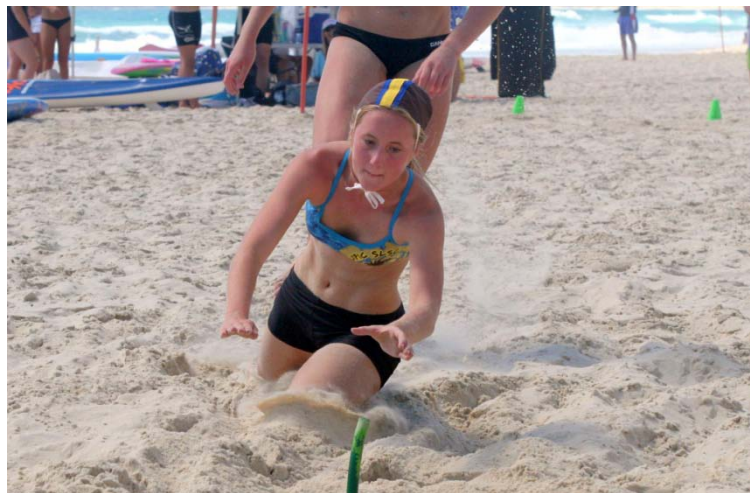
CLUB REPORT – PACIFIC SLSC

Members of Pacific SLSC patrolled the beach for 4538 hours in the 2013/14 season. As well as beach patrols, Pacific SLSC members contributed to Surf Life Saving Queensland Operations Support Services in the areas of Jet Ski, Helicopter, Surfcom and the Jet Boat.

Pacific SLSC members patrolled the beach with enthusiasm and dedication and ensured that Pacific Beach remained free of any major incident.

During the season the Club Trainers worked hard to train fellow members in essential lifesaving awards. To this end the following awards were gained at the Club

- ≡ 10 Surf Rescue Certificate
- ≡ 12 Bronze Medallions
- ≡ 11 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques
- ≡ 3 IRB Crewman Certificate
- ≡ 38 Radio Operators Award
- ≡ 23 Resuscitation Certificates



Thanks are extended to Pacific SLSC Trainers and Assessors for the significant commitment in training new and existing members.

Pacific SLSC is in a sound financial position. This season the club recorded a profit of \$51,000, an increase of 50% from the previous season. Pacific SLSC has \$120,000 in the bank and the club remains debt free. Annual costs remain consistent at approximately \$150,000 per season.

This outstanding result has many contributing factors, the Supporters Club contributed \$71,000, the club received a grant from the Department of Community Safety Lifesaving Services Development Fund for \$16,230 and \$24,350 from the Queensland Gambling Community Benefit Fund. Members raised \$4,137 from the annual tin rattle and \$30,000 from the Surf Girl campaign.

The club has earmarked \$70,000 to be spent on rebuilding the bathrooms and upgrading other areas of the club prior to the start of 2014/15 season.

Pacific SLSC has purchased a new ATV and defibrillator with the funds received from the Queensland Gambling Community Benefit Fund and work has begun on rebuilding club amenities with the funds received from the Department of Community Safety Lifesaving Services Development Fund.

- ≡ Surf Boats – there has been a resurrection of interest in surf boat rowing and the elder statesmen of this sport have been passing on skills to a new generation.

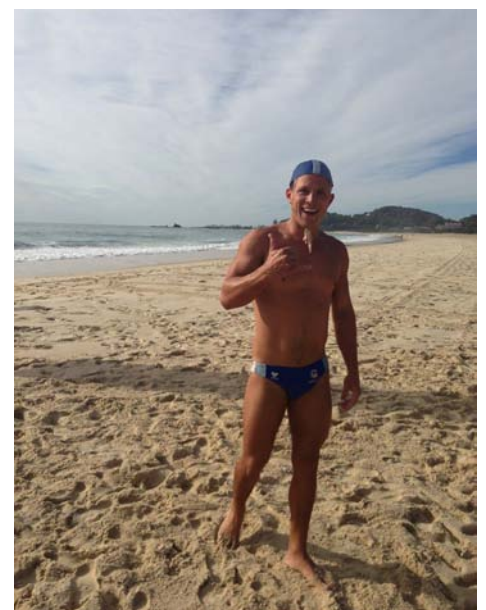
Reflecting on the season, Palm Beach SLSC can be proud of its many achievements in the different portfolios of Surf Life Saving

CLUB REPORT – CURRUMBIN SLSC

Following the election of officers at the 2013 AGM the Club introduced a new management structure and strategic plan, ensuring the Club was operating efficiently and strategically at all levels. A major focus of this structure and plan was strengthening the synergy between the Supporters Club and Surf Club operations, to assist with supporting Currumbin's main goal of delivering essential lifesaving services to the local community and fundamentally the patrons of Currumbin Beach. Although this process faced some challenges initially, this season the Club has started to bear the fruit of reward from the new structure.



The season started off on a high at the SLSQ Awards Dinner with two members winning major awards - SLSQ Lifesaver of the Year and the SLSQ Athlete of the Year. There was certainly a strong sense of pride amongst all club members and this was a good building block to commence the new lifesaving and surf sport season in September. On the beach the Club faced some challenges with award requirements and patrol strength enforcements. At times Currumbin was stretched for resources however in true Vikings spirit, found a way to overcome these boundaries and united together.

In 2013/2014 the Club was lucky to have the services of over 250 patrollers volunteering throughout the season at various stages to assist with patrols. Club Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators were again outstanding, helping the Club process a large number of awards in 2013/2014. Currumbin was fortunate to have a number of youth trainers come through the system in 2013/2014, with two members under twenty conducting two bronze courses over the course of the season and one trainer being awarded the inaugural Currumbin Vikings Certificate 4 scholarship to further their development and skillset in this area.

The Surf Sports season culminated with a fifth placing at the Australian Championships. This was on the back of some impressive lead in results including 3rd place at the Queensland Championships, 1st at the Point Danger Branch Championships and 1st at the Gold Coast City U11-u14 Titles. The clubs leading Ironman, Jackson Maynard achieved his dream of qualifying for the 2014/2015 Nutri Grain Series. Jackson is a third generation Viking and started as a Nipper. With some very talented coaches, new developments in 2014 and the retention of a group of enthusiastic surf sports competitors Currumbin SLSC looks forward to continued success in Surf Sports in the coming season.

Again, the Club played an active role in the community, promoting the Surf Life Saving movement to various school groups throughout the season as well as holding a number of clinics for local schools, sports teams and community groups. Following on from the success in being awarded Queensland's Cleanest Beach Award, Currumbin SLSC went on to take out the National Title with Currumbin Beach named as Australia's Most Beautiful Beach in 2013. As a club, we were also privileged to be able to support the movement at all levels and play host for the U8-U10 Teams Carnival and host a Point Danger Branch Senior Championships and host a major station of the Coolangatta Gold.

Currumbin SLSC once again delighted to support the Point Danger Branch Team X-Treme program in 2013/2014. Twelve club members participated in this program which is a wonderful initiative and a great lifesaving educational program for junior members who aren't necessarily competitors but have a passion for surf lifesaving. This is a fantastic initiative and as a Club, would encourage all Clubs to support this program.

Finally, our thanks to the Executive Committee and staff of Point Danger Branch for your support in what was another challenging yet rewarding year for Currumbin Beach Vikings.

CLUB REPORT – TUGUN SLSC

It has been another successful year for Tugun SLSC both on a surf sports and patrolling front albeit the start of the patrolling season started with some challenges.

The Club put through a number of Bronze squads which has boosted the patrolling numbers which gives the Club the luxury of larger patrol teams which in turn helps to spread the load on the beach. Just as importantly the number of SRC's coming through to the senior ranks is promising and 2015 potentially looks even better. The commitment of these young people is



to be admired and their enthusiasm can at times be quite infectious. The incoming committee will need to focus on the growth in our patrolling ranks to ensure that the active membership numbers remain strong as ultimately successful patrolling is what Tugun SLSC is here for.

The surf sports arena provided some good results with the emergence of the Under 19 Taplin, the growth in R & R and the Aussie Gold Medals achieved by the boat crews. It will be a focus of the incoming committee to continue to work with these teams and grow their sections.

The nippers had another good season with numbers although down on last year being at a more sustainable level. Winning the State Handicap Trophy was the result of good work by all of the Age Managers throughout the season. As a Club, we have acknowledged that the transition from the younger age groups into the SRC and then into the Senior Club has to be handled very proactively to ensure we maximise the numbers coming through. We have started a new program to ensure that this transition is well managed.

There have been challenges in the administrative area with the Club Administrator of 5 years leaving which gave the committee some work to do whilst a replacement was recruited. It was interesting to discover how much knowledge is held by this one person, thus the committee have been hard at work documenting many of the processes and procedures so that this knowledge is recorded and stored to enable any transition to a new administrator to be seamless.

The committee was new this year with only very limited experience in the management of a Surf Club however despite this limited experience, the committee has taken on its role with enthusiasm and commitment and has done a very good job steering this great Club through what has been a demanding and difficult year. The management committee undertook a corporate governance workshop at the start of the season which assisted us greatly in the management of our Club this season. It is an exercise the club will commit to again next year for the incoming committee.

Fundraising was a weak point for the Club this year and is the number one priority of the outgoing committee this year and the expectation is that the incoming committee will continue the work started. The Club has been less than diligent with the collection activity which will be reflected in the end of year results. A fund raising program has been put in place that provides for a good mix of fund raising activities over the next 12 months. An important part of these activities has been the recently established grants subcommittee who have taken over the responsibility of tracking and submitting submissions for these valuable funding opportunities.

I appreciate that this is not the forum to give thanks however I would like to express my gratitude to the Point Danger Branch team who have assisted us this year. Kerrie, without you and your team's assistance we would have struggled to have the successful year we did.

CLUB REPORT – BILINGA SLSC

The membership of Bilinga SLSC deserves congratulations on another successful season, where Bilinga SLSC has shown that as a Club it can achieve great things - which were evident as the host Club for the Point Danger Branch U11-U14 Championships.

The Executive Committee have worked well together and have supported the Club through hard work and dedication. Some of the key achievements for the Club this season include

- ≡ Hosting the Point Danger Branch U11-U14 Junior Championships.
- ≡ Painting of the Club by the Dulux Paint Project.
- ≡ Erecting the Club name on the front of the Clubhouse.
- ≡ Securing a \$75,000 grant from the Jupiter's Community Benefit Fund for the purpose of renovating the rear deck with a roof.
- ≡ Allocation of funding - \$40,000 from the Lifesaving Services Development Fund for refurbishment of existing toilet and shower amenities.
- ≡ Engagement of Burleigh Design to produce concept design drawings for the deck project.
- ≡ Yeppoon SLSC attending the club as part of our Regional Partnership Initiative.
- ≡ First Gold Medal the Queensland Junior Championships.

During the season Bilinga SLSC once again performed a commendable service to the community on and off the beach with limited patrolling members. It is measurable that no lives were lost between the flags and it is due to dedicated vigilance and service of the Bilinga Surf Lifesavers.

The Junior Activities Committee was committed to the development of the nipper members and under their leadership and commitment provided an environment of fun and an opportunity to allow the Nippers to compete at the Branch and Queensland Championships.

The training and assessing team committed themselves to the education of new and existing members. Awards achieved include

- ≡ Bronze Medallion x 6
- ≡ 4WD Induction x 9
- ≡ Resuscitation Certificate x 11
- ≡ Surf Rescue Certificate x 2

Overall Bilinga SLSC has experienced a successful season, with some exciting new developments for the Club in season 2014/2015.



CLUB REPORT – NORTH KIRRA SLSC

North Kirra continued to grow throughout the 2013/2014 season whilst maintaining focus on being a small, family friendly club.

This season, we had a new Club Captain who introduced new ideas to the patrol roster. In particular, each patrol group was allocated to patrol every third Sunday afternoon on a rotation basis. Given that many of the members are not based within the Gold Coast region, this has often been a difficult patrol to fill.

A full training roster was again prepared, complemented by the numerous courses run by Point Danger Branch. North Kirra continued its longstanding relationship with Loganlea State High School with Grade 11 students completing their Bronze and the Grade 12 students continuing their lifesaving training in a variety of awards including First Aid, Basic Beach Management and many more. Point Danger Branch's assistance this season in training and education has been invaluable. In particular, the Team X-Treme program was very well received by North Kirra members with 10 members completing the program. The level of training was second to none.



The nipper program continues to grow in addition to a number of junior members transitioning to the senior club. The enthusiasm of the junior members to commence patrolling often with their older brother and sisters has been a great sight to see. The Junior Activities Committee was again well supported with all age groups having an Age Manager and many also having an Assistant Age Manager. The cadets assisted greatly in meeting water safety obligations and ensuring all nippers remained safe throughout the season. In addition, each age group was again given a target to raise \$400 to keep membership fees low and assist in the purchase of new equipment.

Competition continues to grow at North Kirra with a full training regime run throughout the season. In particular, North Kirra sent 42 competitors to the Queensland Junior Championships and 18 competitors to the Queensland Championships. A number of masters also competed in the Brunswick Heads carnival with many photos to show the strength of the North Kirra SLSC competitors. In all competitions, North Kirra SLSC competitors produced a commendable result.

The Surf and Supporters Clubs both remain in a stable financial position with a focus on diversifying revenue streams as well as limiting costs. The Club is currently seeking to undertake refurbishment of its clubhouse and most importantly, replace the roof. Unfortunately the Club was not successful in gaining the DCS Sustainability Grant for this purpose however alternative grants are currently being investigated.

In closing, thanks are extended to each and every member of North Kirra for their efforts throughout the season. The support of Point Danger Branch and affiliated Clubs is acknowledged and the Club looks forward to another successful season ahead.

There were several significant rescues performed throughout the season particularly on New Year's Day, when two members were confronted with a serious life threatening incident off the beach that required a cool calm approach under extreme pressure. These young volunteer Surf Life Savers did an excellent job in saving this lady's life.

On Saturday 19th April 2014, two members performed a dangerous rescue off the Kirra groyne in large surf that was so significant Kirra SLSC's Vice Captain took the time to send an email to our club detailing the extent of the seriousness of their surf rescue.

Throughout the season, Coolangatta SLSC conducted two wonderful Club activities that helped build esprit de corps - Bronzies Day and the Fallen Lifesavers Memorial day which culminated with the Club Titles on a picture perfect beautiful Coolangatta day.

Bronzies Day will be an annual event for Coolangatta SLSC. New Bronze holders received their red and yellow patrol cap embroidered with their initials and Q qualification number. A special guest was invited to say a few inspiring words about the honour, privilege and responsibility of wearing such a symbolic iconic Australian cap.

On Sunday 27th April 2014, Coolangatta SLSC was selected by SLSQ to conduct a ceremony for the annual Surf Life Saving Memorial day. The Club was honoured to do so and a large contingent of members attended dressed in the Red and Yellow uniforms for a guard of honour and the laying of the wreath at sea. The Club intends to conduct a ceremony every year on this day as so many of the members, young and old, felt such a sense of emotion in being involved.

The Nippers have prospered over the past season, and the committee has done a wonderful job in the development of the nipper members. 97 nippers joined the Club this season and represented the Club at Branch and State Championships.

Coolangatta SLSC competes well and has a strong team that attends several carnivals and competes well as a team. Medals were won at every level of competition including the Australian Masters Championships.

The Supporter's Club has again operated extremely well as a successful business under the leadership of a consistent Executive Board and the management team. In June 2014, Coolangatta SLSC will be undertaking a large redevelopment of the Supporter's Club and the Surf Lifesaver's club rooms.

The Club's Jupiters Summer Surf Girl did an excellent job raising a substantial amount for our club with the assistance of the fundraising committee.

Work is due to get under way very soon with the Sports and Training Centre which has been made possible through a combination of Surf Club funds, Westpac Bank and a \$100,000 Get Playing Grant through the Queensland Government Department of Sport and Recreation.



Overall Tweed Heads & Coolangatta SLSC has enjoyed a very successful season. The senior membership is up marginally. Junior membership has increased significantly which bears very well for the future of the Club. TH&C is only one of three clubs in the Branch that achieved an increase in Nipper numbers and the Nipper committee is to be congratulated on the great job they are doing.

In relation to Lifesaving Operations, the Club has been able to put 13 patrols on the beach which was an increase on the number of groups from season 2012/2013 and the majority of committee positions have been filled.

The vast majority of members are to be congratulated on meeting their patrol obligations. Their combined efforts have seen the Club go through a whole season without incurring any patrol penalties.

The members also dedicated time to gaining new awards including

- ≡ 30 Bronze Medallions,
- ≡ 7 IRB Drivers,
- ≡ 15 IRB Crewman.

Club members successfully undertook 6,346.25 patrol hours throughout the season with 18 rescues and 973 preventative actions/people warned and conducted 43 First Aid cases and 15 marine stings.

This year for the first time in Club's history saw one of the Club members representing Australia in the German Cup. The team won the women's and the overall Championship for the first time.

TH&C SLSC has a small but dedicated team of surf sports athletes and some great achievements have been recorded this season

- ≡ TH&C SLSC Master's competitor Ruth Kemp has once again proved she is an outstanding athlete medalling in all her events at the 2014 Australian Championships.
- ≡ Tess Wartmann competed in Surf Board Riding - winning Gold at the Queensland Championships and Bronze at the Australian championships.
- ≡ Jy Dean won Gold in the 2 km Run at Qld State Championships.

Thank you to Point Danger Branch for their assistance with the Club. Their support throughout the season is greatly appreciated.

CLUB REPORT – RAINBOW BAY SLSC





The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.


Audit qualification

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The ***Please enter Trustee details in 'Notes to the Financial Statements' screen.*** prepared the financial statements of the trust on the basis that the trust is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the trust deed, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the ***Please enter Trustee details in 'Notes to the Financial Statements' screen.*** determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or ***Please enter Trustee details in 'Notes to the Financial Statements' screen.*** valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in shareholders' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by ***Please enter Trustee details in 'Notes to the Financial Statements' screen.*** to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(c) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.

(f) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables, including bank borrowings and distributions payable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money.
